24th Reunion of the Hill 4-11 Association

The 24th reunion of the Hill 4-11 Association will be held June 8-11, 2017 in Cody, WY. Our host facility will be the Buffalo Bill Village Resort, located at 1701 Sheridan Ave. The complex includes a Holiday Inn, a Comfort Inn and the Buffalo Bill (cabin) Village, which are all within easy walking distance of each other.

The Saturday evening banquet will be held at the Holiday Inn Hotel, which will also be the site of our hospitality room.

The Resort has set aside 60 cabins (75% of the Village) for us to have our own semi-private reunion compound. A limited number of rooms are available in each of the hotels, if you prefer. Our special reunion rates are:

- One bedroom cabin \$139.00/night
- Two bedroom cabin \$159.00/night
- Hotel room (either hotel) \$166.00/night

These rates are also in effect for 3 days before and 3 days after the dates of our reunion, subject to room availability.

Reservations should be made directly with the Resort at 307-587-5544. Tell them that you are with the "3rd Battalion, 1st Infantry" (code: ZUJ) and let them know which accommodations you prefer. Because of the extreme popularity of the area during the summer, it is recommended that you make your reservations early, especially if you would like to stay extra days before or after the reunion. The Resort will begin taking reservations on October 1st.

There is plenty of complimentary on-site parking. You may park an RV in designated areas; however, you may not stay in the RV.



"The Rock"

I was deployed to Co. C, 3d Bn, 1st INF, 11th LIB, 23d INF Div (Americal) located at Base Camp Bronco in February of 1968. I was pulled from the field and reassigned to HHC in May. I became an aide and driver for the Bn. XO, Major James Henrionnet. While I was in the mess hall one day, someone noticed that I was sketching a picture of my fiancé and mentioned it to Maj. Henrionnet. He asked me if I thought I had the ability to paint, and I said yes.

In order to get supplies for this project, and while a rock was found and relocated by the Engineers, Captain Fernando Garcia and I went to Quang Ngai City

It took me two weeks to sketch and paint the 1st Inf. crest on the rock, and unfortunately, once it was painted, it

became an aiming point for the VC and NVA in the area. I was shot at about 4 times while I was working on the rock, and it could be seen all the way to the border.



I found out later that once the Division was deactivated and the base camp was turned over to the ARVN, the rock was repainted with the colors of the South Vietnamese flag. I was also told that eventually, the rock was destroyed by the NVA.



Johnny had been a fixture at our reunions until the death of his close friend and former platoon leader, Jeff Baden, shortly before the Moline reunion. Many "Deltas" owe our membership in the Association to his dogged determination to locate former members of his beloved Delta Company. He will be greatly missed.

James Cronkwrite

James Cronwrite, better known as "Sparky," passed away on May 27, 2016 from kidney failure and other complications. Sparky served with E Troop during 1969-70. On the night of July 14, 1969 during a sapper attack on Hill 4-11, Sparky



helped "Doc" Bruce Nugent rescue and recover SGT Larry Techmeir who was mortally wounded by sappers while he was checking the perimeter wire.

Steven Knuboff, better known as "Doc Knuboff," passed away on June 26, 2016. Doc Knuboff was a medic with the Weapons Platoon of A Company during 1969-70. He lost several friends during a battle with the NVA on May 13, 1970.
